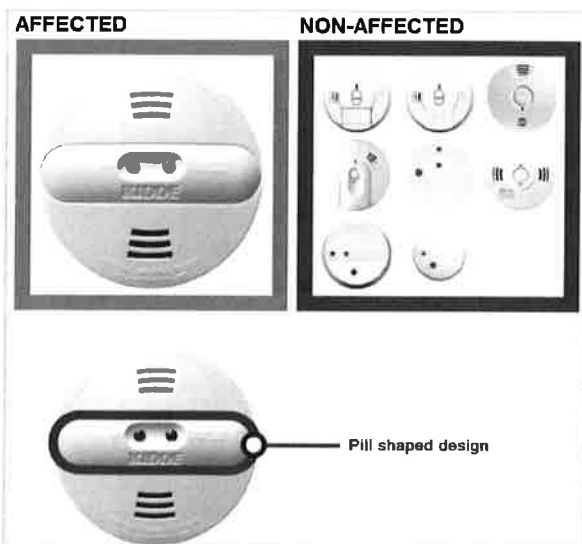

SMOKE ALARMS RECALL

This recall involves two models (**PI2010CA** and **PI9010CA**) of Kidde dual-sensor smoke alarms manufactured between September 10, 2016 and October 13, 2017. The recalled products were sold from November 1, 2016 to January 25, 2018. The model number and date code are located on the back of the unit. The affected smoke alarms have a pill shaped design on the front of the unit. The affected units have a yellow cap visible through the opening on the side of the alarm.

The North Shore Fire Department reminds residents that there is No daytime burning during the fire season from April 01-Oct. 31 each year. Burning permits are required year round. Please burn safely! Thank you :)

Did you know that a wildfire is any fire that starts outside in grass, brush, shrubs or forests? By checking off everything on this list, you will be helping to protect animals, trees, plants and your home!

- yes no I rake dead leaves, sticks and pine needles off my lawn.

- yes no I make mulch piles to protect our garden, and keep weeds away. (Make sure to keep mulch away from your house. This will help to prevent fire from spreading to the home.)

- yes no My garden has Firewise flowers and plants in it. (These are plants and flowers that help keep fire away from homes because they hold more water and grow lower to the ground so flames don't touch them.)

- yes no I remove leaves and twigs from under the deck.

- yes no I sweep the deck or porch to get rid of pine needles and leaves.

- yes no I make sure to give plants and shrubs plenty of water.

- yes no I carry all the leaves, sticks, pine needles and everything else I collected to a safe place to mulch (preferably) or to the landfill for burning.

If you answered, "yes" to all these questions, good for you. Keep up the good work! If you answered "no" to any of them, try to start doing them today.

The planet will thank you for it.

PREVENT CONFLICT WITH BEARS

Bears are a part of the natural environment. They are not a nuisance. Bears should be respected: never purposely feed bears (or other wildlife) or try to approach them.

Relocation and destruction are poor ways of trying to prevent conflicts with bears.

You can prevent conflicts with bears by following these steps.

Limit food sources

- put garbage in containers that have tight-fitting lids, and put them out only on the morning of garbage day, not the night before (you can purchase specially designed bear-resistant containers, which work best)
- take garbage to the dump often, if you do not have curbside pick-up
- frequently wash garbage cans, recycling containers and lids with a strong-smelling disinfectant
- fill bird feeders only through the winter months
- put away feeders in the spring and instead, offer birds natural alternatives (e.g., flowers, nesting boxes, fresh water)
- do not leave pet food outdoors, in screened-in areas or porches
- do not put meat, fish or fruit in composters outside (keep scraps in the freezer until garbage day)
- pick all ripe fruit from trees and bushes and fallen fruit off the ground
- remove grease and food residue from barbecue grills, including the grease cup underneath, after each use
- inform cottage renters of how to avoid attracting bears to the property

Keep your eyes and ears open

- travel in groups of 2 or more (bear attacks occur primarily on people who are alone)
- make noise as you move through areas where visibility is restricted or where background noise is high, such as near streams and waterfalls (e.g., singing, whistling or talking will alert bears to your presence, giving them a chance to avoid you)
- while outdoors, keep your eyes and ears open:
 - scan your surroundings to check for bears
 - do not wear music headphones
 - watch for signs of bear activity (e.g., tracks, claw marks on trees, flipped-over rocks or fresh bear droppings)
 - if you are out with a dog, leash it (uncontrolled, untrained dogs may actually lead a bear to you)
 - pay attention, especially if you are working, gardening or berry picking
 - occasionally scan your surroundings to check for bears
 - rise slowly if you are in a crouched position so that you don't startle nearby bears

Take safety precautions

- carry and have a readily-accessible whistle or air horn
- learn how to use bear pepper spray and carry it readily accessible
- consider carrying a long-handled axe, if you are in "remote areas or deep in the forest"

Take community action

It takes the local community to prevent conflicts with bears. You may be doing your part, but if your neighbour is not, you may still encounter a bear on your property as a result.

Commit your community to becoming Bear Wise. Remind your neighbours to do their part by:

- sharing this information with your neighbours
- starting the conversation about how you can work together to prevent conflicts with bears (e.g., making sure the whole street waits until morning to put out garbage for collection)

Township of The North Shore Council would like to remind residents that all three (3) garbage & recycling bin sites are being monitored by video surveillance and that **NEW Bylaw 15-36**, with set fines, passed Nov. 2, 2015 **will be enforced**.

Garbage bins are for household garbage only. All construction and building materials are to be brought to the Serpent River Landfill Site. No fire place or woodstove ashes.
