**POSITION TITLE/POSITION LEVEL:**

Public Works Employee

**REPORTING RELATIONSHIP:**

Reports directly to the Clerk or delegate, in his/her absence

**SCOPE OF POSITION/SUMMARY OF DUTIES:**

Must take direction from the Clerk and assume all duties relating to the maintenance of township properties, including green spaces and buildings.

**RESPONSIBILITIES include but not limited to:**

- 4.1 Accepts general direction from the Clerk or through a motion from Council;
- 4.2 Ensures that Occupational Health and Safety practices are strictly observed;
- 4.3 On Call hours for Water Treatment Plant, educational requirements to obtain Water Certification.
- 4.4 Responsible for the maintenance and repair of public works equipment;
- 4.5 Responsible for locating potential problems with the township roads system and make/or arrange for the necessary repairs before they become safety hazards and/or causing an inconvenience to the public;
- 4.6 Under the direction of the Clerk, liaises with contractors/trades people on projects;
- 4.7 Provides regular reports to Clerk on (i.e.) status reports on projects, information on maintenance programs and investigation on public complaints;
- 4.8 Must perform or assist with the thawing of culverts, fixing washouts, hauling gravel, road sign maintenance and patching repair and maintenance of water breaks and lines;

- 4.9 Responsible for the maintenance and improvements of the cemetery, including the opening, closing and marking of gravesites.
- 4.10 Maintains parks, trails, boat launches and playgrounds in a clean and safe condition;
- 4.11 Maintains municipal buildings and property;
- 4.12 Other duties as assigned.

**KNOWLEDGE AND SKILL:**

As determined by Council in order to maintain a high level of public service. Requires practical, mechanical, woodworking, plumbing, masonry and construction skills with related experience. Knowledge of Provincial Minimum Road Standards and culvert installation an asset. Computer knowledge (internet, spreadsheets, word processing) an asset as well.

**WORKING CONDITIONS**

Working hours are 40 hours per week. Monday to Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. as well as on call hours every second week.

Work is subject to physical hazard and weather conditions.

Job direction may change mid-stream when emergencies happen.

Must maintain a daily log book.

## **Clean Up Week July 23 - 27 Municipal Pickups Only**

This is to accommodate the disposal of larger items and debris that does not normally qualify for collection during the rest of the year. The refuse should be easily accessible and should not include any hazardous materials.

Refrigerators and freezers have to be tagged to indicate that the Freon (a harmful, global-warming contributing chemical) has been removed or they will not be picked up. In addition, doors and lids to refrigerators and freezers must be removed before they are left outside for collection.

We are unable to remove derelict vehicles or heavy articles. E-waste (electronic waste) and tires are acceptable. The public works employee shall determine the acceptability of the refuse to the landfill site should this become an issue.

Residents should contact the municipal office at 705-849-2213 or 705-461-1821 during regular office hours Monday to Friday (8:30 am - 4:30 pm) to arrange for pick up during that week. Public works will then attend your residence and bring the refuse to the landfill site free of charge.

Township of The North Shore Council would like to remind residents that all three (3) garbage & recycling bin sites are being monitored by video surveillance and that **NEW Bylaw 15-36**, with set fines, passed Nov. 2, 2015 **will be enforced**.

**Garbage bins are for household garbage only.** All construction and building materials are to be brought to the Serpent River Landfill Site. No fire place or woodstove ashes.

# Barbecue Safety

*Grilled to Perfection Every Time!*



**USE BBQS OUTDOORS ONLY!** They produce **carbon monoxide**, a poisonous gas that can lead to unconsciousness and even death. Never use or store propane cylinders inside any structure, including garages.

## Take these steps when starting a BBQ:

- Open the hood.
- Turn on the gas release valve on the tank.
- Turn on the grill controls or heat settings.
- Take a step back.
- Push the igniter button.
- If there is no igniter button, insert a long match or BBQ lighter through the side burner hole first, then turn on the heat control knob.
- If the burner does not ignite right away, turn the gas off and wait five minutes, keeping the hood open, before repeating the procedure.

## At the start of the BBQ season, do this **THREE-STEP SAFETY CHECK** of your BBQ:

- 1 CLEAN** Use a pipe cleaner or wire to ensure burner ports are free of rust, dirt, spider webs or other debris.
- 2 CHECK** Examine the hose leading from the tank to the burners. Replace it if cracked or damaged.
- 3 TEST** Find leaks by applying a 50/50 solution of water and dish soap to propane cylinder connections and hoses. If bubbles appear, tighten the connection and/or replace the damaged parts and retest.

## Stay Fire Safe!

Never leave the BBQ unattended when in use.

Make sure grease does not build up on the burners or at the base of the BBQ. This could cause a grease fire.

**Never throw water on a grease fire** – this will only spread the flame.

**DO NOT** place the BBQ close to wooden fences or walls, vinyl siding, or anything that can burn. The area behind your BBQ must be free of anything that can ignite – this is where hot gases escape.

Keep loose clothing away from a hot BBQ.

Keep children and pets at least one metre (three feet) away from a hot BBQ.

When finished barbecuing, turn the gas valve off first, then turn off the burner controls so no gas is left in the connecting hose.

Allow the BBQ to cool completely before closing the cover.

If you live in an apartment or condo building, check with the building owner or property manager, or the Condominium Act of your building, regarding the use of BBQs on your building's balconies.

## FLYING FOR FUN?

### RULES FOR RECREATIONAL DRONE USERS

Consult the [safety measure](#) for the full list of rules.

**It's the law!** If you fly your drone for fun and it weighs more than **250 g** and up to **35 kg**, follow these rules.

#### Fly your drone:

- within 90 m above the ground or lower
- at least **30 m away from vehicles, vessels, and the public (if your drone weighs more than 250 g up to 1 kg)**
- at least **75 m away from vehicles, vessels, and the public (if your drone weighs more than 1 kg up to 35 kg)**
- at least **5.5 km from aerodromes (any airport, seaplane base, or areas where aircraft take-off and land)**
- at least **1.8 km away from heliports or aerodromes used exclusively by helicopters**
- outside of controlled or restricted airspace
- at least 9 km away from a natural hazard or disaster area
- away from areas where it could interfere with police or first responders
- during the day and not in clouds
- within your sight at all times
- within 500 m of yourself or closer
- only if clearly marked with your name, address and telephone number



Following these rules will help keep people, aircraft, and property safe. If you do not follow these rules, you could face fines of up to \$3,000.


