TO CONSIDER a proposed amendment to Zoning By-law of the Corporation of the Township of The North Shore pursuant to the provisions of Section 34 of the *Planning Act, R.S.O., 1990*.

Applicant: Darien Aggregates Inc. c/o Province of Ontario (Crown Land)

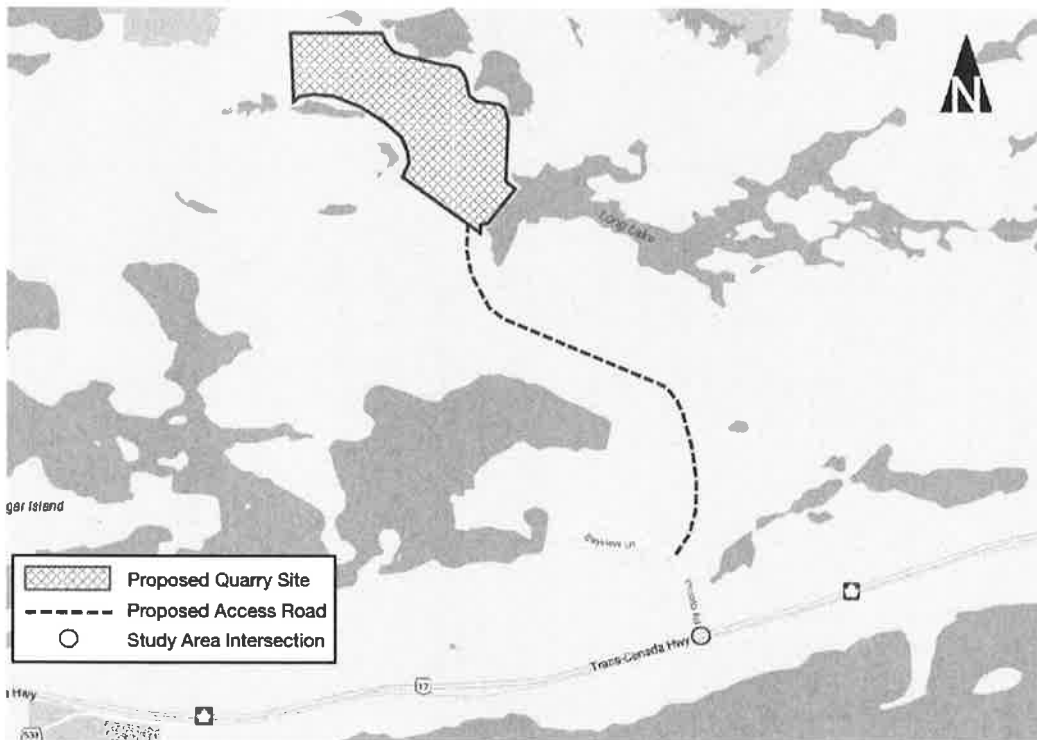
Location: Long Township, Township of The North Shore, District of Algoma – 3.5 km north of Highway 17

West, accessed off Pronto Road.

Proposal: The purpose and effect of this zoning amendment application is to rezone the lands to permit and allow the development of a new Class A – Category 12, below water quarry.

Additional Information: Several technical reports, studies and plans submitted in association with this application are available as noted below. The lands are also subject to an application under the Aggregate Resources Act, to permit a new quarry on a 115.3 hectare parcel (permit area) with an extraction area of approximately 68.3 hectares.

ANY PERSON OR AGENCY may make written submissions to the Township of The North Shore before a decision is made on the file. We would advise **AGENCIES** wishing to make a written submission to do so no later than **April 15, 2019**.

ANY PERSON may attend the public meeting and/or make written or verbal representation either in support of or in opposition to the proposed zoning by-law amendment.

IF YOU WISH TO BE NOTIFIED of the decision of Council on the proposed zoning by-law amendment, you must make a written request to the Clerk-Treasurer of the Township of The North Shore (see address below).

IF A PERSON OR PUBLIC BODY does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Township of The North Shore before the by-law is passed the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision of the Council of the Township of The North Shore to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal.

IF A PERSON OR PUBLIC BODY does not make oral submissions at the public meeting or make written submissions to the Township of The North Shore before the proposed zoning by-law is passed, may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to do so.

PLEASE NOTE all comments and submissions received will become part of the public record. Comments received as part of the public participation process for this proposal will be considered by Council.

Make It Stop! Advice for dealing with nuisance alarms

Sometimes smoke from a toaster, an open oven door or even steam from a shower can cause a smoke alarm to activate. This is referred to as a nuisance alarm. To stop the annoying sound, people often remove the battery or disconnect the power source and forget to reconnect it.

Disabling the smoke alarm means if a fire were to occur at a later date, the smoke alarm would not sound and the occupants may not have the time they need to safely escape. Every year, people die in fires in homes without working smoke alarms.

There is a good reason why the sound of the alarm is loud and persistent: it is intended to get your attention when there is a fire. It can't do this without power. Do not take the battery out or disconnect the power if you experience nuisance alarms. There are alternatives that can help you solve the problem for good.

Here are a few simple steps you can take that could eliminate some nuisance alarms caused by cooking activities:

- Keep ovens and stovetop burners clean
- Clean out accumulations of crumbs in the bottom of toasters and try turning down the timer setting and
- Use the fan on the range hood when cooking to help remove steam and combustion particles from the air

If this doesn't solve your nuisance alarm problem, check out the topics on the left. They describe practical options to deal with nuisance alarms so your smoke alarms are working and ready to warn you of a real fire emergency.

TRAILERS ON VACANT LOTS

If the trailer is being used for living purposes, even on a short term basis, it is not considered as being stored on the land, or placed for sale. All properties are created as vacant land. When a structure is added, the value of the land increases which adds to the assessed value of the land, thus taxed accordingly.

When a trailer is simply placed on the land and is being used for living purposes, then that land is no longer vacant and the municipal taxpayers are cheated of taxable income that could be used for improvements to the municipal infrastructure and services.

Aside from the tax issue, parking a trailer on a lot does not require a building permit. A building permit is required when a structure is added to the lot. The building permit ensures that proper health and safety rules are in place through inspections of a qualified inspector.

Without a building permit, these rules are not enforced and such issues as drinking water source, septic and grey water disposal is not addressed. Without a building permit the placement of the trailer may not be within the required set backs from any waterway or neighbouring properties.

PROPERTY STANDARDS COMMITTEE SEEKING NEW MEMBERS

The Township of The North Shore is currently seeking new members for the Property Standards Committee.

The Committee exists to hear appeals from any property owner within the Township who has been issued an Order To Remedy by the Property Standards Officer on his or her property, and to which the property owner disagrees.

The committee meets four times per year for general meetings and again whenever an appeal is filed. Usually there are no more than one or two appeals heard per year, so the time required for this committee is not overwhelming.

Remuneration for meetings and mileage is offered. Members are required to own property within the Township and have the ability to be fair and objective in the decision making process.

The Appeals Committee is an independent body of Council and staff and its rulings are based on the merits of the complaint and appeal evidence. The Committee has the same powers as the Property Standards Officer; in so much as they have the authority to either confirm the Order as it was written by the Officer; rescind the Order entirely; extend the timeline given to carry out the particulars of the Order; as well modifying the Order in whatever manner the Committee decides upon.

The Appeals Committee fills a very important role for the Township. Without an Appeals Committee; there can be no Property Standards By-Law enforcement.
